

## KEY TO ABBREVIATIONS AND EDITIONS USED

### Works by Gerhard Roth:

*Aufzeichnungen*: *Aufzeichnungen eines überflüssigen Menschen*, unpublished manuscript of Roth's first novel, part of which was transformed into *die autobiographie des albert einstein*.

*einstein*: *die autobiographie des albert einstein*, 1972. See *MBM*.

*Ausbruch*: *Der Ausbruch des Ersten Weltkriegs*, 1972. Originally published together with *Künstel* and *How to be a detective* in the volume *Der Ausbruch des Ersten Weltkriegs und andere Romane*. See *MBM*.

*Wille*: *Der Wille zur Krankheit*, 1973. See *MBM*.

*Horizont*: *Der große Horizont*, Frankfurt/M: Suhrkamp, 1974. (= suhrkamp taschenbuch 327).

*MBM*: *Menschen, Bilder, Marionetten - Prosa, Kurzromane, Stücke*, Frankfurt/M: S. Fischer, 1979. All references to the 'Kurzromane' above use the page numbers of this readily available anthology of Roth's early work.

*Morgen*: *Ein neuer Morgen*, Frankfurt/M: Suhrkamp, 1976.

*Winterreise*: References are to the first hardback edition, Frankfurt/M: S. Fischer, 1978. The page numbers of Fischer Taschenbuch 2094 do not concur with the edition used in the dissertation.

*KLGG*: *Kindlers Literaturgeschichte der Gegenwart*, München, 1976 - . The abbreviation is followed by the relevant volume title.

*m*: *manuskripte*, the literary journal of Graz's 'Forum Stadtpark', edited by Alfred Kolleritsch and Günter Waldorf, Graz: 1960 - . References take the form *m*/issue number/year. Kolleritsch's occasional 'marginalien' are largely unpaginated.

*Wiesmayr*: Elizabeth Wiesmayr, *Die Zeitschrift 'manuskripte': 1960-1970*, Königstein/Ts.: Hain, 1980.
